## **DENTAL TRAINING FOR MISSIONS**

I received a request recently from an older gentleman to take my course. He reminded me of my first US student 11 years ago. He's a retired pharmacist who always wanted to be a dentist. Tom still goes to Honduras regularly serving the poor. Recalling Tom's success story moved me to welcome Dale without hesitation. Dale, a retired pastor actively involved in his local pastors' association, was a dental auxiliary and educator in the air force for many years. He was thrilled to take this course and get back into dentistry again. It's so rewarding to train someone with that level of enthusiasm. He thoroughly enjoyed the course.

Dale and I teamed up with Kevin Cooney (a former student) for two clinics at churches in Matamoros, Mexico. I always pray that God will provide good patient cases for my students to learn. God came through again! We had around 100 patients! Kevin, who is 31 and on track for a career in tribal missions with his family, had a great opportunity to refresh and increase his skills. After our clinics in Mexico, Kevin returned to his mission school while Dale and I held a clinic at a Spanish speaking church in Brownsville— Iglesia Mennonita. This is where Denise and I attended when we first came to Brownsville. Dale lives 90 minutes from Piedras Negras, Mexico and plans to connect with a Christian ministry there to provide dental clinics.

Luke (an Oklahoma farmer and nurse) did my dental course a few years back. He loves dental ministry. He has been spending about a 4-6 months a year in Africa (Sudan, Chad).
