They have a great ministry to women teaching income generating skills. Their facility was filled with women busily working on their projects. I

was invited by Troy Livesay (of Heartline) to come and train him along with three Haitians from various

Along with Troy, I trained Winifred Louisville (Heartline), Clotilde Thermadore (Three Angels Children's Relief) and Junior Sinsmyr (Awaken Haiti). They were all motivated—eager to learn and enthusiastic about dental ministry. What a joy it was for me to train this group!

DECEMBER

MEXICO (MATAMOROS): In December we had two students, Liz Ann and Beverly Sterling, take the course course here in Texas. We did our practical field clinic in Matamoros serving two churches. Liz is a Canadian and private practice dental hygienist from British Columbia and Beverly is an American nurse serving as a full-time missionary in Nigeria. Bev operates a medical clinic and, along with her husband, an orphanage with 31 kids. She certainly will have much occasion to use her skills in their ministries.



Liz is a dental activist in Canada working to expand the clinical functions of the dental hygiene profession in her province. I accepted her because I believe hygienist should provide ART so they can provide care to those in North America who cannot afford a dentist. She is a Christian and is very dedicated to her profession and the people she serves. Liz has a very generous and giving heart.

It was a joy to train Liz Ann and Beverly. We treated numerous patients in two separate churches. One church was a new contact, a pastor and business man. He has a very gentle and humble spirit who truly wants to bless his congregation and community. Because of violence across the border, our Mexican hosts lodge us so we can stay off the roads at night. He and his wife took great care of us and want me to return.



LOVE INC: After much prayer, I (Denise) and my fellow board members and our Executive Director, decided to shut down this ministry at the end of 2012. It was a difficult and sad decision for us to make as each of us has a heart for the needy in this area and for the church to be involved in meeting those needs. Love INC had been in existence for 10 years and had helped meet the needs of over 3,000 people. The ministry struggled for most of those years with finances and getting churches to participate. We have a sense that God is letting this ministry go for a time and has better plans for the future.

JANUARY

MEN'S MINISTRY CONFERENCE: I attended a men's week-end conference at South Padre Island with about 14 men from our church. It was a time of worship and Christian teaching on numerous themes. They had quite a number of local pastors speak, all limited to ten minutes. It was amazing to see how much pastors can put into a ten minute talk. I was inspired in my faith and encouraged. I would like to pass on to you a thought on humility that blessed me: *"Humility is not thinking less about ourselves, but instead, not thinking about ourselves."*

CENTRAL CHRISTIAN CHURCH / RIVER CHURCH: I was blessed recently to share about dental missions at two local churches here in Brownsville. I was invited by my friend David Nuckols (from Bread of Life) to give a short talk at CCC. I talked about the effectiveness and practicality of dental ministry and some important tips on successful short-term missions. Azarja and Renee, who attend this church and are supported by them, Skyped in that morning to share with the congregation. We were so proud of them. It was all part of the church's missions emphasis week. And also at our new home church, I was asked to share about a recent mission outreach I did with *To Every Tribe Mission*.

TO EVERY TRIBE MINISTRY: Largest dental class ever! I was excited in January to train 14 students. Yes 14! And the only reason I was able to pull it off was because of God's help and Kevin Cooney's (a former student). I told you about Kevin in the last letter. He co-taught the class with me. It was unique and challenging in that I experimented with a new training approach: simplifying our enamel breaking technique and dividing the students into teams of two. This permitted us to accelerate the training and launch into patient clinics after only two days of lab practice. (Photos coming in next letter)

CENTENARIO, MEXICO: Centenario is a small village about 90 minutes south of us. I went with 12 students from the above class. This was the first of two scheduled field clinics. I think we saw around a hundred people in the course of a week. We set up 6 student stations who worked in teams of two. There is no better way to learn than working on real people. Kevin helped me supervise freeing me to do some extractions. He was also eager to learn injections and extractions, so I coached him through some of that. He welcomed every opportunity - living up to his name: "The Dental Beast!"

The community was very happy we came and invited us to return. I received a praise report saying this clinic opened doors of opportunity for TETM's mission team working there.

As you read this I should be in Southern Mexico with some of these same students doing our second field clinic. I'll tell you more next time.

FEBRUARY

GUATEMALA: I was in Tactic, Guatemala from 1/31-2/12 with Impact Ministries. What a touching time it was. I'll share much more about this trip in our next newsletter.

PRAISE REPORT! We received this email today (2/26): "I would love to learn more about your A.R.T. training program. I'm preparing to move to Sierra Leone to work as a community health nurse this coming fall... I feel like this training would be quite useful to the community I plan to serve... All our girls are doing well. We sure are missing Renee and her family. We're so thankful for phones and especially video Skype. Please keep them in your prayers as they continue to adjust to being in South Africa. They're having a bit of a struggle dealing with strong-willed Esther.
