DENTAL TRAINING FOR MISSIONS

Oaxaca Mexico 2014

This year's trip to southern Mexico went very well. This was a field trip with students we had trained in the fall with *To Every Tribe Mission* in Los Fresnos, Texas. We traveled to a very remote mountain village just over a mountain ridge from the Pacific Ocean. The purpose of this trip was to give our students practical clinical experience. This builds their confidence for future dental ministry in the developing world.

This mission trip coincided with the recent release of the New Testament translated in the native dialect of this local area by SIL translators. Members of our team were thrilled to witness the joy of people hearing the Scriptures spoken in their native tongue for the first time.

There were a total of eight mission students trained in this year's class.

FYI: Are Root Canals Safe?

In the last year I have come across a book titled: "Root Canal Cover-Up" and other online writers claiming the same. I've had three people recently asking me about root canals: my daughter, son-in law, and a friend, whom all had serious dental issues. They asked about the safety of root canals. This is a very common dental treatment and I thought I would pass on to you what I shared with them:

The information published by Dr. Weston Price, the authority of Dr. Meinig's book mentioned above, is extremely outdated (by 90 years). I don't believe for a moment there's a "cover-up." That accusation alone is enough to discredit the book in my view. I know far too many dentists, some who are dear friends and brothers and sisters in the Lord, to entertain that idea. Endodontics is a sound modality in treating teeth with serious pulp disease when performed correctly, preferably by an endodontist. It is certainly preferred over an extraction. He and Chantée are both registered nurses and also work part-time at a local hospital.

I asked Luke some time ago if they might pray about joining our dental ministry as volunteers. He and Chantée did so and feel the Lord leading them to serve with us. Thank you Lord! During their visit, they joined me on a clinic to have more time to interact and learn. It was fascinating that our first patient had the exact tooth problem they had questions about the previous

evening. Here it was in real life! I also gave them an overview of a two-day seminar I had attended on a more advanced technique in dental extractions. Luke was eager to learn since he had started doing extractions in the field.

Jason and Megan Padvorac: I spoke about Jason in my last letter. He was one of my most motivated students ever. After he took our dental class with TETM, Jason, Megan and their baby, traveled to Thailand to care for refugee children on the Thai-Burma border. He emailed me a few times with some questions, and faced every challenge with courage and faith.

More recently, Jason and Megan traveled to Oklahoma to assist me in that class and to discuss the future. I'm thrilled about this couple. Jason is a bio-engineer by profession and Megan has her doctorate in philosophy, having served as an adjunct university professor. Jason and Megan, along with Luke and Chantée, are now officially part of our volunteer dental training staff.



DTFM Accreditation and Ministry Planning Session

While at IBCD, Jason, Megan, Luke, Chantée and I visited with Dr. Paul Yii and Dr. Young-Gurl Kim to discuss our collaboration and association with IBCD. Dr. Kim invited our mission to unite with IBCD under their academic umbrella. He is working on full accreditation for all their courses, including the dental component. John Brown University presently awards college credit to JBU students taking our dental class through IBCD.

Also, Jason, Megan and I discussed our vision for the future of this mission. It was an exciting time for me as I have been praying for pioneering visionaries to come on board with us in this ministry.

DTFM Dental Research Project

Jason came across a little known treatment for teeth that seems very promising and has documented proven results by Japanese researchers in the Journal of LSTR Therapy, VOL 7: 1-5, 2008. It is claimed that this treatment prevents the need for dental extractions and root-canals in most infected and painful teeth. Dr. Paul, myself, Jason and Luke decided that we, as a dental mission, should test this treatment for ourselves in the field.


HOPE BEYOND HELL MINISTRY
